

Intensive Interaction



Intensive interaction is a great way to help children learn that communication can be both fun and useful. In school, these sessions are sometimes done in a quiet room but are also completed throughout the day when adults “copy” a child as we get on with everyday tasks such walking down the corridor, having lunch or playing in the classroom etc.



Key points

- Allow your child to lead - respond to things he does. This can be by joining in with him or playfully imitating him. By responding instead of leading we don't make demands on him; instead we communicate that we value him and enjoy being with him.
- This can be done at any time and will hopefully mean your child will be highly motivated to practice and develop his communication abilities because this is enjoyable and meaningful.
