



 <p>Adventures of Adam</p>	 <p>LACING CARDS FREE! HOMESCHOOLPRESCHOOL.NET</p>	 <p>A DD GLUE</p>	
<p>Make slime, add 'ingredients' e.g. googly eyes. The activity is to remove these using tweezers or peg.</p> <p>Cornflour slime recipe https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/t-he-449-cornflour-slime-awe-and-wonder-science-activity-sheet</p>	<p>Thread wool / shoelace in and out of the lacing cards. Draw simple shapes and then hole punch to thread through.</p>	<p>Hole punch letters - draw a simple themed shape e.g. bat, cauldron etc. and write uppercase or lowercase letters around the edge. Either call out a letter or pull one out of a bag (pre written) and then the child punches the hole.</p>	<p>Create cardboard hoops and witch hat cones. Try and throw the hoops over the witch hats.</p>

Cookery Ideas

 <p>Wizard Wand Biscuits</p> <p>Ingredients 300g plain flour 200g butter (at room temperature, cubed) 100g caster sugar Icing sugar and water or royal icing Food colouring of your choice Sprinkles</p> <p>Method 1. Pre-heat your oven to 180C. 2. Mix the flour, butter and caster sugar together in a bowl until it makes a smooth dough. 3. Roll the dough out until it is about 1cm thick. 4. Use your cutter to cut out star shapes. 5. Carefully insert a stick into the edge of each star shape so that it looks like a wand. 6. Place your biscuits on the baking tray...</p>		 <p>Witches Hats Learning and Exploring Through Play</p>

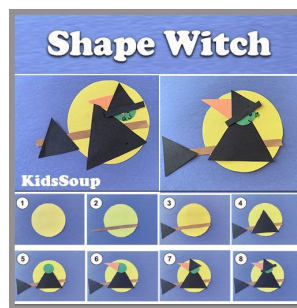

Mathematics



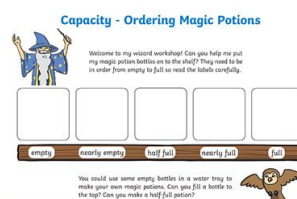
Matching numbers - write numerals on the pegs and write the numeral (9) or number name (nine) on the brown paper brush end. Peg the peg to the paper to match numbers.



2D shape witches - using shapes build the witch picture.



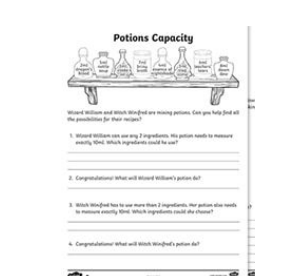

	<p>Paper plate witches face. Paint it green. Let it dry. Cut out a witch's hat shape. Glue wool or sting for the witch's hair. Add facial features.</p>	 <p>WITCH HAT Decorating</p>	<p>Draw and outline of a witch or wizard hat. Decorate with stickers, foam shapes, pieces of wrapping paper or anything you may have at home.</p>
<p><i>Witch Broom</i> PAINTING</p> 	<p>Just cut off a piece of a napkin or paper bag and use scissors to make slits on one side (like a fringe). Next wrap the napkin around the bottom of the straw and secure the napkin or paper bag in place with tape.</p>		<p>Wrist owls - You will need 1 toilet paper tube, construction paper Small feathers, 1 pair of dot stickers (optional) 1 small triangle of self adhesive foam or construction paper 1 pipe cleaner, brown or black markers.</p>
<p>SHAPE WITCH craft for kids</p>  <p>inspired by Room on the Broom</p>	<p>Using a range of different shaped card or paper create a witch or wizard face.</p>	<p>Wrap a toilet paper tube with construction paper, then use tape (or glue) to attach feather wings and ear tufts. Use a marker to draw the owl's eyes – or – use dot stickers for an extra pop of color. We added details to our sticker eyes with a Sharpie ultra fine point markers. Attach a small triangle of self-adhesive foam for the beak (or just use a snippet of orange or yellow construction paper). Finish by punching 2 holes on the bottom of the tube. Thread a pipe cleaner through the holes, then fasten the owl to your wrist.</p>	
	<p>Stripy Mog pictures (from Meg and Mog). Draw a simple body outline and then glue strips of black laler to make a stripy cat.</p>
