ALL ABOUT SNAILS.



Snails are one of the slowest creatures on earth. There are three groups of snails – land, sea and fresh water snails.

Their bodies are soft and moist and are protected by a hard shell.



Most snails are herbivores. This means they eat leaves, stems and flowers.

Snails move on a 'foot' underneath their body.



Land snails come out at night and on cloudy days. They don't like the sun as it dries them up.
