







Orange class curriculum map - Autumn 1

This is Gold Classes curriculum overview for the Autumn 1 term. This overview gives you a brief explanation of what the pupils will be doing in school. It also gives you suggestions of activities to support pupils learning at home. These are only suggestions, not compulsory activities.

<p>Topic</p> <p>Our topic this half term is called All about me. We will be learning about:</p> <p>Week 1- back to school Week 2- likes and dislikes Week 3- friends Week 4- family Week 5- senses Week 6 – senses Week 7 – body parts Week 8 – body parts</p> 	<p>Maths</p> <p>We will be covering number, measure and using and applying each week. The children will have two classroom based lessons and one computer based lesson.</p> 	<p>English</p> <p>This half term our English focus is lovely books- We are reading a book called I will not ever eat a tomato.</p>  <p>It is a story about a girl who is a fussy eater but by using her imagination she is able to overcome that problem.</p>	<p>Phonics/ Reading</p> <p>Pupils will be learning the sounds of letters and how to blend sounds to read words. They will continue to use the Read, Write, Inc scheme.</p> <p>In reading the pupils will be developing reading skills by either reading to an adult several times a week from a book or by reading individual words or symbols.</p> <p>We will visit the library once a week to look at books.</p>	<p>Cookery</p> <p>Our cookery focus this half term is sandwiches The children will be making some delicious sandwiches with lots of different fillings.</p> 
<p>Things to do at home...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Look at family photographs, especially of them when they were younger - Talk about different body parts and name them - Sing songs about their bodies e.g. - Ask and answer where and what questions - Share books about likes and dislikes (linked to the story) - Explore different sandwich fillings, talk about which ones they like and where they maybe do not like - Match and sort everyday items e.g. match identical socks or can they sort the socks from the pants? - Investigate shape around the house, outside, in books and everyday items. Can they stack or roll 3D shapes? - Explore their sense - what do you see? Hear? 	<p>PSHE</p> <p>This half term we will be learning about being more independent in school as well as recognising familiar people in their environment.</p>	<p>Orange Class All about Me</p>  <p>Autumn 1 Overview</p>	<p>Speech & Language</p> <p>We will be having speaking and listening groups which will focus on the children extending their listening skills and being able to take turns and ask each other simple questions and listen to their answers. The children will be split into two different groups.</p>	<p>PE</p> <p>Our PE is run by John and this half term he is focusing the children on getting back into the routine of listening to his instructions and moving and stopping when he bangs the drum. He will be playing games with them and encouraging them to move in different ways.</p>
	<p>Computing</p> <p>We will be using our computer sessions for computer based maths and English sessions. While in these sessions we will still be developing the children's knowledge of how to use different functions of the computer.</p>	<p>Trips</p> <p>At the moment this half term we have not planned any trips, as we wanted to see where we stood with covid19.
